

As readers, we will develop our inference and explaining skills through exploring the picture book 'Jemmy Button' by Jennifer Uman. We will make comparisons about Jemmy's home and his trip to England. Thinking of our courageous advocacy, we will develop and strengthen our persuasive writing skills through creating adverts or informative letters. As poets, we will include a range of different poetic devices in our writing.

In History we will learn about the changing power of monarchs through the ages. We will start by learning about who King John I was, followed by King Henry VIII, Elizabeth I, Charles II, and lastly, King Charles III. We will be participating in a mixture of writing and drama activities to understand.

In computing, we will work on our desktop publishing skills. with the terms 'text' and 'images' and emojis and understand that they can be used to communicate messages offline and online. We will learn to change font size, colour, and begin to edit.

In PE, we will enjoy batting games on the field with Albion in the Community, as well as doing dance lessons with a focus on carnival of the animals. We will be working on control, balance, and precision.

As scientists, we will learn about animals including humans, focusing on teeth, the digestive system, and food chains. We will develop our scientific enquiry skills through engaging in investigations or experiments, strengthening our observational skills and allowing us to draw solid conclusions based on findings.
